INTERPRETATION

1. In these By-Laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall be construed in the manner in this section mentioned:-

"CHAIR"

used in respect to the Town Council, means the Mayor, Presiding Councillor or Chairman presiding at any meeting of the

Council of the Town of a Committee thereof

"CLERK"

used in respect to the Town Clerk, means the Town Clerk of the Town.

"COMPANY"

includes Corporation.

"COUNCILLOR"

or

"MEMBER"

means a member of the Town Council of the

Town.

"MINISTER"

Minister means the Minister of Municipal

Affairs.

"OWNER"

when used in relation to any property within the Town, includes an agent having the care or control of any property of an

absent owner.

"POLICE COURT"

means the Court of the Stipendiary

Magistrate for the Town.

"STIPENDIARY MAGISTRATE"

means the Stipendiary Magistrate of the Town and includes the Deputy Stipendiary

Magistrate of the Town and also any additional Stipendiary Magistrate appointed

under the provisions of any enactment.

"STREETS"

includes every street, highway, lane, road, footway, thoroughfare, alley, by-way,

passage, court, square, sidewalk or bridge and every part thereof, lawfully used by

the Public of the Town.

"TOWN"

means the Town of Port Hawkesbury.

"TOWN HALL"

means the building in which the Town Clerk

has his office.

"TOWN SOLICITOR" means the Town Solicitor of the Town whether appointed annually or in a particular matter or matters and includes the Deputy

Town Solicitor.

2. The provisions of "The Interpretation Act" Chapter 151 of Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1967, and amendments thereto, in so far as applicable, shall apply to all By-Laws of the Town of Port Hawkesbury and the interpretation of the words, expressions, and clauses therein stated shall be given to the same respectively where used in the said By-Laws, except in so far as the same are inconsistent with the context or with the intent and object of the By-Laws.

- (c) when a meeting is requested by three members as provided in the Towns Act.

Written notice shall be given at least twenty four (24) hours before any meeting of the Council (including meetings called by three members of the Council), such notice shall specify the time and place of meeting and shall be signed by the Town Clerk or by such three members of the Council and shall be left at the usual place of abode of the usual place of business of each member of the Council, provided that an emergency meeting may be called by the Mayor at shorter notice when necessary, but no business shall be transacted at an emergency meeting other than that indicated in the notice calling the meeting, unless all members of the Council are present, and no objection is taken to the discussion or transaction of business other than that stated in that notice.
